## Matthew Patrick Smyth

Fabric collection debuts in spring

A Celtic knot, an antique Indian block print, and a marbled pattern of interlocking circles form the basis of Matthew Patrick Smyth's new fabric designs. Inspired by motifs found in folk art, antique textiles, and vintage apparel, the New York-based designer's first line of fabrics takes on a primarily neutral palette to enhance classic style. ## Kazumi Yoshida

Capturing simple pleasures

Artist Kazumi Yoshida of Celine Linder translates traditional Japanese fragrances—at least temporarily—into design: a limited-edition bottle for one of Celine Linder's best-selling fragrances. He took a cue from his Japanese heritage and the blooms, birds, and butterflies of his own garden to create the bottle and coordinating candle. The duo merges the light-hearted spirit of the scent. "When you look at the design, you can almost smell the fragrance," Yoshida says. Fragrance, \$38 for 2.5 ounces, \$32-\$50 for 5.5-ounce candle (celinelinder.com).

Lulu de Kwiatkowski's colorful collages in her new book, *Lulu (Amo Books, \$20)*, give insight into her design inspirations.





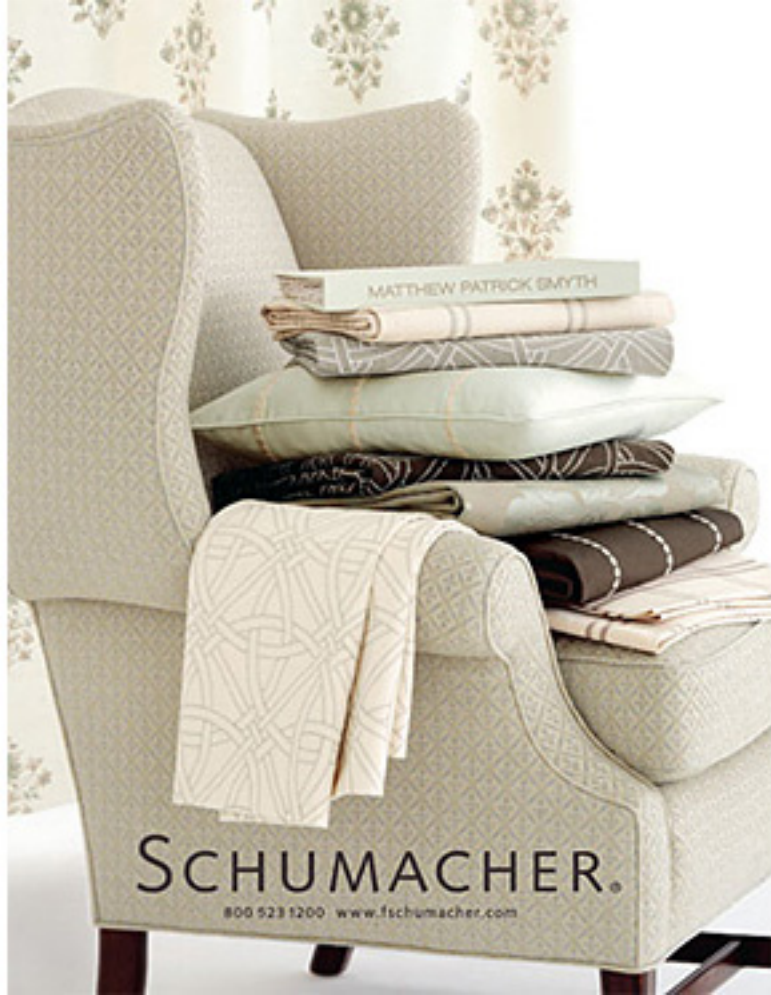
